The California Air Resources Board (ARB or Board) invites you to participate in a public workshop on December 15, 2009, to discuss draft regulatory language for a regulation requiring energy efficiency and co-benefits audits of large industrial sources. In December 2008, the Board approved California's plan to reduce the State's greenhouse gas emissions to 1990 levels by 2020. This Scoping Plan is a central requirement of Assembly Bill (AB) 32, the Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006. One of the measures included in the plan requires facilities emitting more than 0.5 million metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent (MMTCO₂E) to conduct an energy efficiency audit of individual combustion and other direct sources of greenhouse gases to determine the potential reduction opportunities, including those for criteria pollutants and toxic air contaminants. At this workshop, we will discuss staff's proposal and provide stakeholders an opportunity to comment on the draft regulation.
