

Dear Mr. Blumenfeld:

The Air Resources Board (ARB) hereby submits as a revision to California's State Implementation Plan (SIP) the <u>2008 Owens Valley PM10 Planning Area</u> <u>Demonstration of Attainment State Implementation Plan – Revised Managed Vegetation Best Available Control Measure</u> (Revised BACM). We request that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) act expeditiously to find the Revised BACM complete, and fully approve it as part of an enforceable framework for actions taken to attain the PM10 national ambient air quality standard (NAAQS) in the Owens Valley.

On July 18, 2011, following a duly noticed public hearing, the Great Basin Unified Air Pollution Control District (GBUAPCD or District) adopted the Revised BACM. The Revised BACM redefines the minimum overall average vegetation coverage level as 37 percent, replacing the 50 percent minimum coverage level specified in the 2008 plan. The District determination that 37 percent coverage will achieve the 99 percent emission reduction target called for in the 2008 plan is based on substantial research and monitoring conducted on existing areas of managed vegetation. The Revised BACM also amends the 2010 PM10 Maintenance Plan and Redesignation Request for the Coso Junction Planning Area submitted to U.S. EPA on July 14, 2010, which incorporates the Owens Lake dust control plan by reference.
