**Subject: AB 2588 Program Consistency Statewide
Statewide Audit Request**

Dear Mr. Venturini:

It appears that many districts are not consistently implementing the AB 2588 Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Information and Assessment Program. This has come to our attention during the ARB's current fee setting effort. A summary table has been developed by the ARB that shows the industrywide inventory efforts being made by various districts. This data indicates an unrealistic variation between districts in the number of sources in the industrywide source categories compared to population.

For instance, the SCAQMD shows 14,000 industrywide facilities while the BAAQMD only shows 2000. Yet the population of the BAAQMD is slightly less than half the SCAQMD. There should be approximately 6000 industrywide facilities in the BAAQMD because the industrywide facilities category is made up of mostly gas stations, dry cleaners, and autobody shops which tend to be located proportional to population. Additionally, some small districts reported no industrywide facilities or an unrealistically small amount of industrywide facilities.

Since this data is used to calculate a district's portion of the State's costs it is important that the number of sources be consistent and accurately reported by all Districts. Districts with accurate data showing the number of facilities in the industry wide category must pay a larger portion of State costs than those districts that have not generated accurate facility counts.

Ordinarily we would not be concerned with the efforts other districts expend. But because deficiencies in other districts will raise the fees of local businesses beyond what is proportionally fair, our concern has been raised.

In addition, the degree of effort district's expend will also limit the effectiveness of moving to an emissions/toxicity based fee system as currently required by State law. We are concerned that districts's that do not provide accurate toxic emissions data will be able to again take advantage and be assigned a proportionally smaller portion of State costs than more accurate districts.

We recommend that a statewide audit of the program be initiated so that inequities can be eliminated. We also believe that this will help districts which are not fully implementing this program. These districts could then go to their Boards with the results of the audit so that they can ask for adequate resources to fully implement the program.

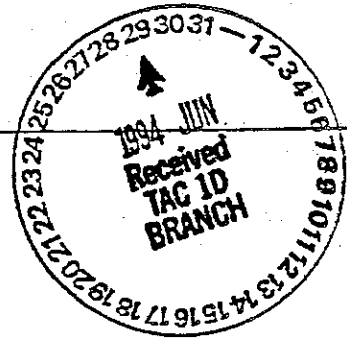


Subject: Comments on Proposed Amendments to the Air Toxics Fee

ISSUE PAPER

AIR TOXIC ASSESSMENT FEE FOR OILFIELD OPERATED BY INDEPENDENT CRUDE OIL PRODUCERS IN THE SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY

ISSUE: Using Standard Classification Category (SCC) process count as the sole determinant for calculation of the Air Toxic Fee for oilfields operated by independent crude oil producers within the San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District does not result in a fee based on the toxic emissions or risk priority for "Plan and Report" facilities as required by SB 1378 (McCorquodale).

DISCUSSION: Both the current and proposed amendments to the Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Fee regulation use SCC process count as the basis for calculating the Air Toxic fee for facilities in the "Plan and Report" category. Under the definitions a Plan and Report (simple) facility has one or two SCC processes; a Plan and Report (intermediate) has three to five SCC processes; and a Plan and Report (complex) has more than five SCC processes. While this scheme is simple to administer, two factors unique to facilities operated by independent crude oil producers the San Joaquin Valley cause this approach to result in fee calculations which far exceed either the toxic emissions or risk priority for these types of facilities.

The first unique factor is the definition of stationary source used in the San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District (SJVUAPCD) for oilfields. Unlike the standard definition which requires facilities under common ownership to be adjacent or contiguous in order to be considered as a part of one stationary source, the SJVUAPCD definition for oilfields groups together all oilfield leases within a specified geographic area. As a result, small oilfield leases many miles apart are lumped together in determining whether the "stationary source" is required to submit an emissions inventory plan and report. Similarly located leases in other District (if each is a less than a 10 ton per year facility) would generally only be required to respond to a survey and thus would not be subject to the "Plan and Report" fee schedule.

The second factor, unique to oilfields, is that the number of SCC processes is not a good predictor of an oil production facility's complexity or potential to emit toxic air contaminants. As shown on enclosed Table 1, even the simplest oilfield would have at least 4 SCC processes and perhaps as many as 6 or 8. As such, if an independent oil producer operates several scattered oilfield leases within a stationary source, as defined by the SJVUAPCD, these oil leases will be classified as intermediate or complex even if each lease consists of only a few wells, a few tanks and a small tank heater.

This conclusion appears to be borne out when the number of Plan and Report facilities by category in the SJVUAPCD are compared to results reported by the SCAQMD and to results reported on a statewide basis, as shown on enclosed Table 2. While both the SCAQMD and Statewide results show similar percentages of intermediate and complex facilities, the SJVUAPCD results show a somewhat higher percentage of intermediate facilities and a much higher percentage of complex facilities.

IMPACT: Independent crude oil producers in the San Joaquin Valley have faced rapidly escalating air toxic fees over the past few years at a time when many of us are struggling to survive. Many independent crude oil producers were stunned when we recently received our fiscal year 1993-1994 air toxic fee statements, with invoiced amounts of \$1,715 to 4,276 per stationary source. Under the proposed fee schedule, these same scattered oil leases will be assessed fees of either \$1,945 or \$5,013 per stationary source. The total air toxic fees per company, at this proposed level, will nearly equal and may exceed the total cost of permit to operate renewal fees for permitted equipment for a typical independent crude oil producer.

POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS: Independent crude oil producers believe that there are more equitable formulas for calculating air toxic fee which we would like to share with ARB staff. Two possible solutions are: (1) fees based on total equipment counts instead of on SCC process counts; and (2) redefining the oilfield stationary source definition in the SJVUAPCD rules, for air toxic purpose only, to make the definition consistent with that used by other Districts within California. Under this second approach, non-contiguous, non-adjacent oilfield leases would be reevaluated to determine if individually they are still classified as "Plan and Report" facilities. This approach would facilitate a more consistent methodology for administration of this statewide program and not unduly penalize San Joaquin Valley independent crude oil producers.



GM-Hughes Electronics wishes to submit comments regarding the proposed Air Toxics Hot Spots Fee Regulation amendments. As a major California employer and manufacturer of defense and non-defense electronics, GMHE has always sought to maximize cost and production efficiencies while minimizing environmental impacts. With this philosophy in mind, GMHE has wholeheartedly supported the State's policy of tying emissions fees and costs directly to emissions volume and toxicity. Unfortunately, the Board's current proposed amendment to the Air Toxics Hot Spots Fee represents a departure from the parity of this approach.

While GMHE supports the revisions to the program which would shift administrative costs away from the State to the affected Hot Spot facilities, we are also concerned that the corresponding fee increases be allocated in a fair and proportionate manner. Facilities with no significant process or emissions changes, otherwise known as Survey facilities, should receive greatly reduced minimal fees under the program, much as is proposed in the revisions. Similarly, we support the Board's proposal that facilities submitting plans and reports but requiring no Health Risk Assessment or Notification should have reduced fees. Our primary concern is with the fee allocation attributable to the HRA and Notification facilities.

The incorporation of the "Simple-Intermediate-Complex" criteria of allocating cost, while superficially practical, fails to address the more important issue of emission quantity and toxicity. Greater fees should be assessed to facilities with greater total and higher hazard emissions, not to facilities with a greater number of processes. Electronics manufacturers, such as GMHE, typically have many processes with low volume, low hazard emissions. These facilities would be penalized more heavily than those facilities engaged in single or few process, high toxicity/volume emission activities. In short, the Toxic Hot Spots Fee should be tied to the volume and hazard of emitted toxics, not to how many processes from which they escape. Dear Ms. Shiroma:

The Mojave Desert Air Quality Management District (MDAQMD) recommends and supports the capping of the air toxic fees for the following three (3) categories of facilities:

1. Small Business, \$300
2. Plan and Report - Simple, \$800
3. Risk Assessment District - Simple, \$2,000

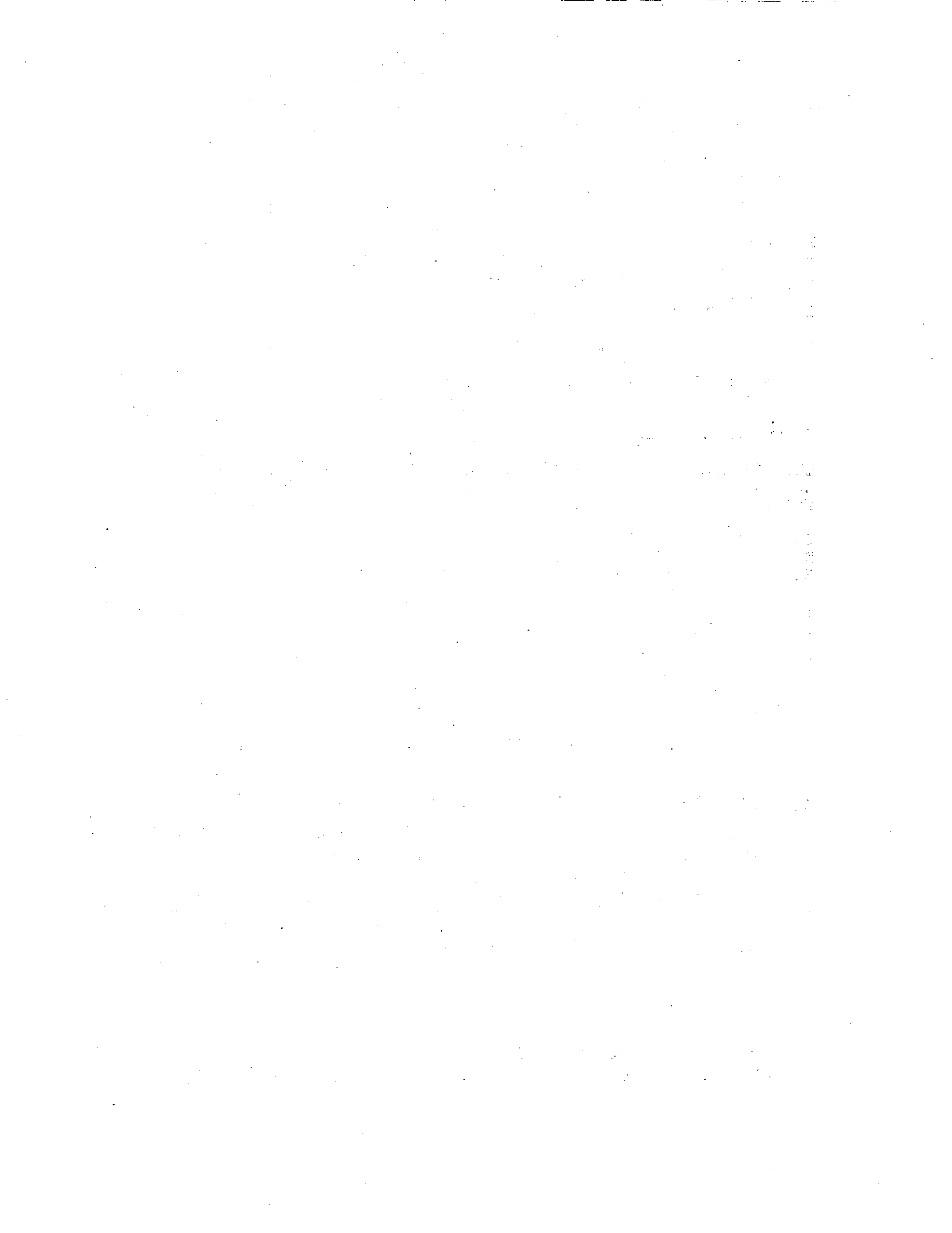
The reasons that the MDAQMD recommends and supports the above caps are as follows:

- A. The fees for these 3 categories of facilities were capped in the Fee Regulation for Fiscal Year 1993-1994.
- B. Since both the state and the MDAQMD budgets were reduced for fiscal year 1994-1995 the air toxic fees for facilities in the "Small Business" and "Plan and Report -simple" categories should also be reduced.
- C. The air toxic fee for the "Risk Assessment District - Simple" was capped at \$1,230 for fiscal year 1993-1994 and the proposed uncapped fee for fiscal year 1994-1995 would be about \$3,100. The proposed cap of \$2,000 will reduce the impact of the fee increase.
- D. Most facilities in these 3 fee categories are small to mid-size business and are among the industries adversely affected by the current economic times.



Dear Sir/Madam,

We have reviewed the Air Resources Board (ARB) staff recommended amendments to the Air Toxics Hot Spots Fee Regulation for fiscal year 1994-95, which will be considered for adoption by the ARB Board on July 28-29. We believe that ARB staff, in conjunction with the Air Toxics Hot Spots Fee Regulation Committee, has done an admirable job in developing a reasonable methodology for addressing how fees will be collected to recover the costs of implementing the hot spots program.

At the same time, we have some serious concerns regarding the revenues that the June 1994 Staff Report indicates our District will be required to remit to cover the State costs of the hot spots program. The Staff Report shows a 58 percent increase in fees for our area over what had been assessed in the 1993-94 fiscal year. This is sharp reversal from last year, where the adoption of the Facility Program Category method for assessing fees resulted in a 40 percent decrease in the BAAQMD share of State costs.

A dramatic increase in our hot spots fees is not warranted because our District has moved forward quickly in implementing the hot spots program, resulting in a reduced workload to the State. For example, at this point in our program, we require essentially no OEHHA or ARB health risk assessment review or public notification assistance. This is not the case for many of the other districts.


We understand from ARB staff that the fees in the Staff Report are being revised. It appears that one of the major reasons that our fees were originally projected to increase was because of inconsistent interpretations among the districts regarding the type of facilities that should be included in the Industrywide category. The ARB staff recently clarified this issue, proposing a modified definition of the Industrywide category, and asked the districts to re-assess their facility counts. We have provided our updated facility counts to the ARB, and we now understand from ARB staff that our fiscal year 1994-95 share of State costs should not increase over 1993-94 levels.

We are pleased with this outcome, and commend the ARB for taking measures to assure that the methodology is being more uniformly applied.

I am writing to commend ARB for the public input process you have offered for the Hot Spots Program/Fees during the past two years. I have attended almost all the meetings, both in Sacramento and in Los Angeles as a representative of the Metal Finishing Association of Southern California. MFASC has some 150 member shops in the greater Los Angeles/Orange county area and have an average of 20-30 employees.

I thought it was a valuable experience to have regulators actually listen to the concerns of industry, and for representatives of industry hear your problems with the Hot Spots program.

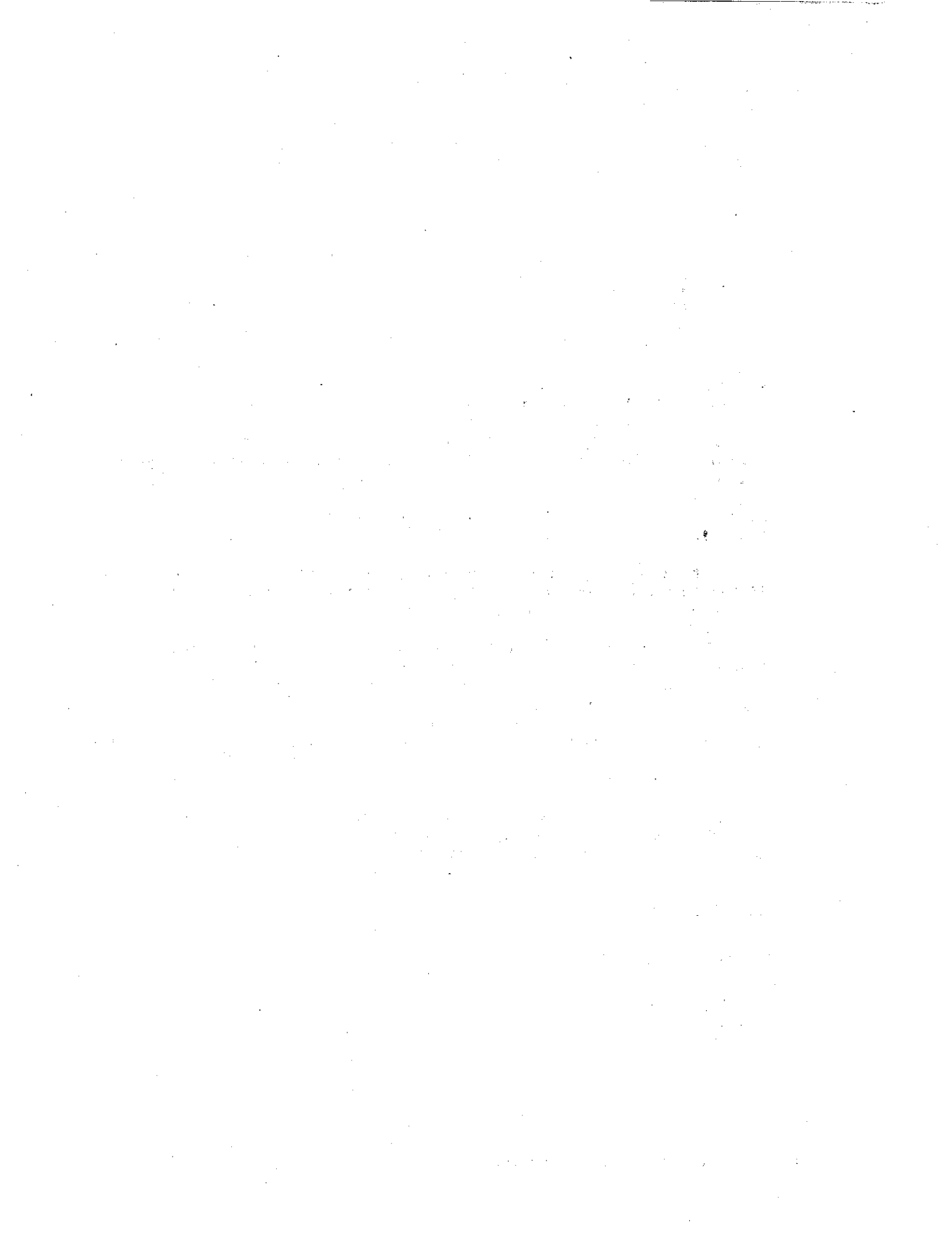
The two most valuable outcomes from these meetings were (1) hearing that while the fees may be outrageous one year, there is a good chance that they will go down the next year, and (2) the cap on fees for very small businesses. Escalating costs for Hazardous Materials fees and licenses are a real concern to business. To illustrate this I have attached a schedule of the my company's fees and licenses for the past 5½ years, which clearly shows the alarming rise in fee expense. Foss Plating Co has 35 employees.

Again I commend ARB for the public input process. I believe that by working together, industry and government can do a better job of solving California's very real problems with air pollution.

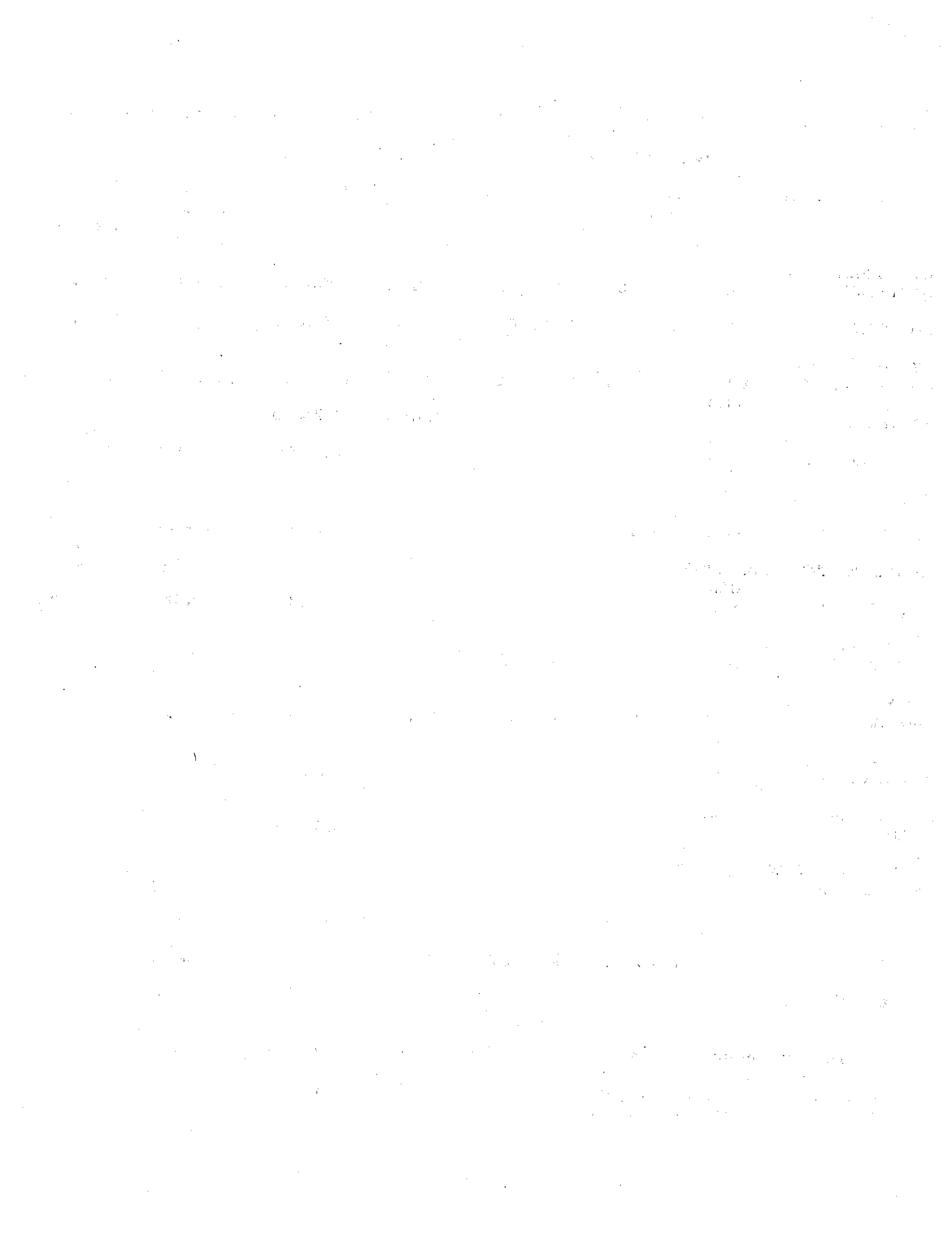

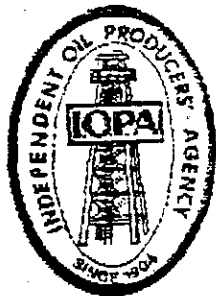

However, your staff has been extremely helpful in trying to ease the burden of this program to small business, of which most of our members are. IOPA supports the lowering of the small business fee cap from \$700 to \$300.

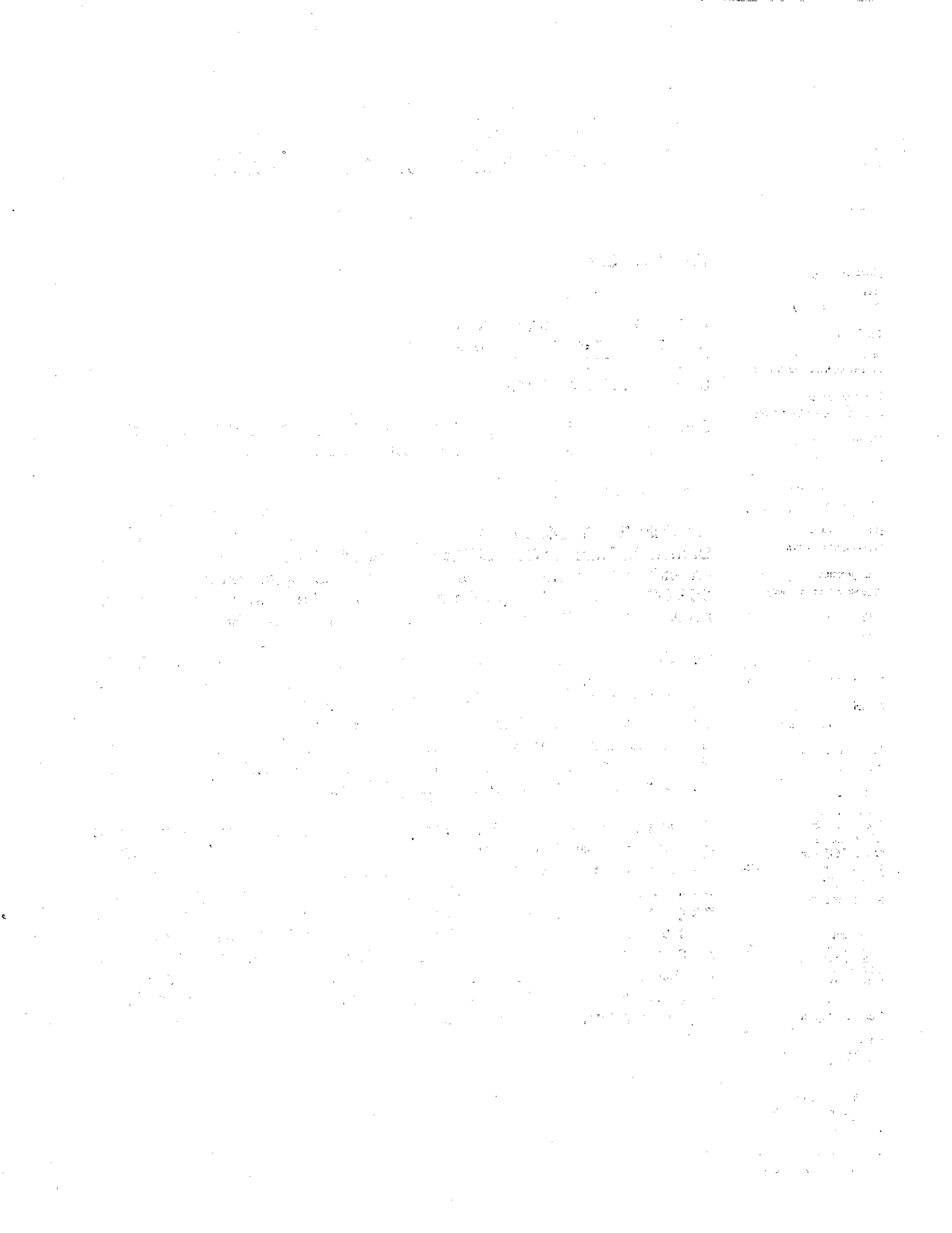

On July 21, 1994, the Governing Board of The San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District (SJVUAPCD) reviewed the proposed amendments to the air toxics "hot spots" fee regulation for fiscal year 1994-95 and solicited public comments. The following suggestions reflect the Board's decision and the consensus of the Governing Board.

On July 28, 1994, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) is scheduled to consider adoption of new Air Toxics Hot Spots Fees for 1994-95. On behalf of the SJVUAPCD, I must inform you that we are extremely concerned with the burden that the proposed fees impose on the businesses throughout the State of California, including the Valley. We believe that the fees can be reduced without sacrificing public health and our ability to implement the mandates of the State law.

As you may know, at the District level, through reorganization and staffing cuts, we have substantially reduced our cost for implementing the Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Program. The primary impetus was to consolidate and more efficiently implement both the State "hot Spots" program and the Federal toxics program under Title III. Over the last year we reduced the staffing for the program from 30 to 18 positions. At our hearing, the industry representatives argued for similar action at the CARB level and I wish to encourage you to consider all measures that would result in actual cost cutting and a more efficient implementation of the program.

We are concerned that the State's portion of the program costs has not been reduced proportionate to the changing scope of the program. The CARB staff report provides an impression that the State's cost are reduced by \$933,000 since 1993-94. However, a major portion of this reduction is due to fund-balance rollover of \$750,000. Therefore, the State's cost has only been reduced by \$183,000, or by 3.5 percent of the 1993-94 budget. We are concerned that without permanent reduction in cost, the program fees in the future years must be raised even further, or more drastic reductions must be made in future in lieu of the availability of sufficient fund-balance in the future. Therefore, to avoid a larger problem in the coming years, we believe that a much larger permanent reduction in the State's cost is warranted.

We are also concerned that the fee methodology used poses a disproportionate burden on the medium sized-businesses. For instance, in our District, 539 facilities (18% of the 2925 facilities subject to AB 2588) will have to bear 88% of the total cost of this program.


If sufficient cuts can not be made to lower the fees for all source categories, to more equitably distribute the cost, we have the following suggestions:

1. Establish a tiered fee schedule for small businesses based on their complexity using SCC counts. We suggest \$200 for simple, \$300 for intermediate, and \$400 for complex sources.
2. Readjust the fee for industry-wide sources to \$125 and use the added revenue to reduce the cost for medium-sized facilities in the simple to intermediate categories.



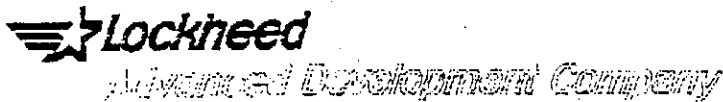

Lockheed Advanced Development Company (LADC) is submitting these comments regarding the Board's Air Toxics Hot Spots Fee Regulation amendments. We urge that the Air Toxics fees be based on the volume and hazard of air toxic emissions, not the number of processes at a facility.

LADC has always sought to maximize production and cost efficiencies while minimizing environmental impacts. With this philosophy in mind, LADC wholeheartedly supported the State's policy of tying emissions fees and costs directly to emissions volume and toxicity. Unfortunately, the Board's current proposed amendment to the Air Toxics Hot Spots Fee represents a departure from the parity of this approach.

While LADC supports the revisions to the program which would shift administrative costs away from the State to the affected Hot Spot facilities, we are also concerned that the corresponding fee increases be allocated in a fair and proportionate manner. We agree with the approach taken by the Board in assessing reduced fees for facilities with no significant process or emissions changes and for facilities submitting plans and reports but requiring no health risk assessment or notifications. However, we do not agree with assessing fees based on the number of processes at an affected facility.

The incorporation of the "Simple-intermediate-Complex" criteria of allocating cost, while superficially practical, fails to address the more important issue of emission quantity and toxicity. Greater fees should be assessed to facilities with greater total and higher hazard emissions, not to facilities with a greater number of processes. Aerospace manufacturers such as LADC typically have many processes with low volume, low hazard emissions. These facilities would be penalized more heavily than those facilities posing the same amount of risk, but engaged in single or few process, high toxicity/volume emission activities.



In short, the Toxic Hot Spots Fee should be tied to the volume and hazard of emitted toxics, not to how many processes from which they escape. In fact, this method is mandated by Health and Safety Code section 44380(a)(3).

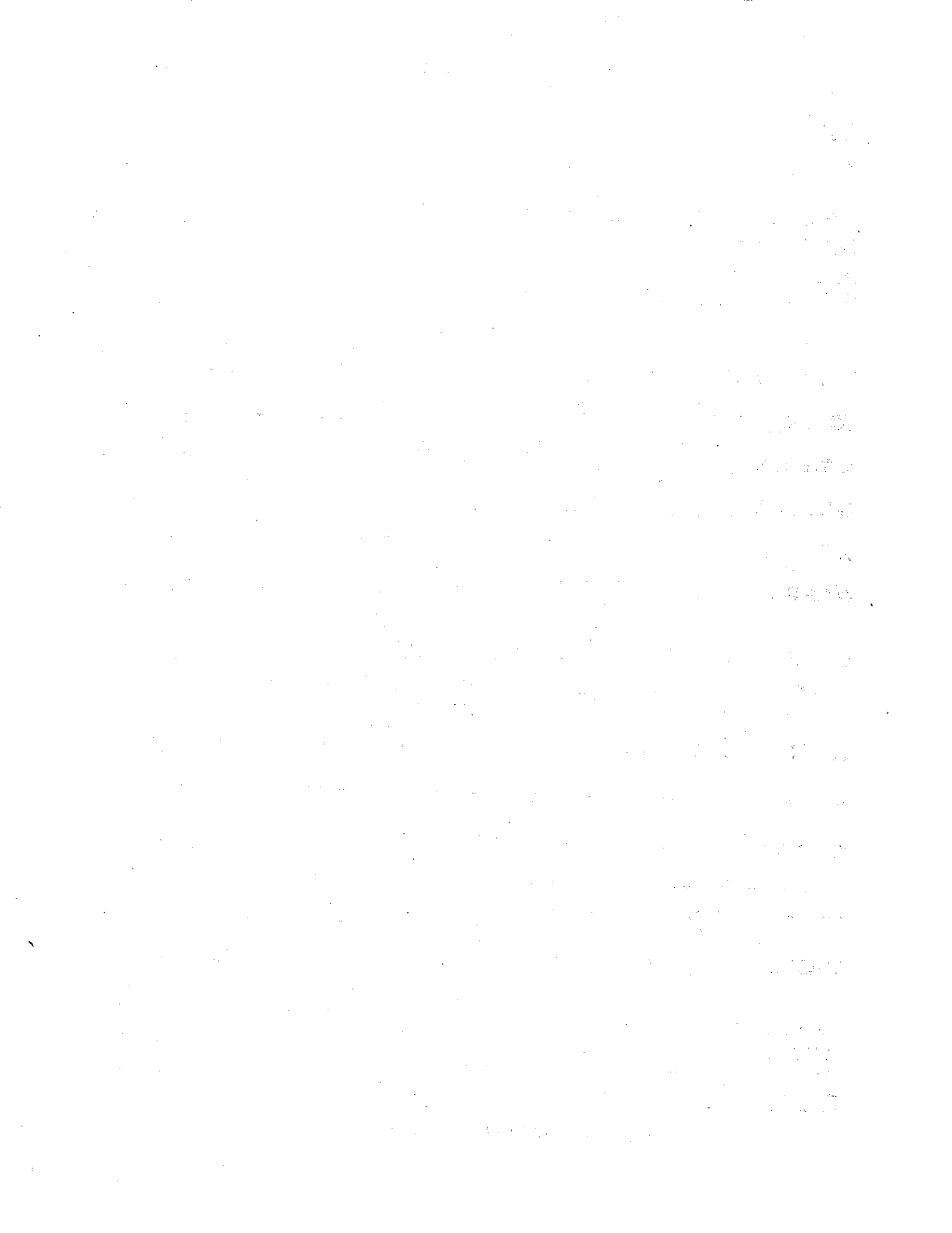


The member companies of the California Aerospace Environmental Association (CAEA), which include Allied Signal, GM-Hughes Electronics, Lockheed Advanced Systems, McDonnell Douglas, Northrop Grumman, Rockwell, and TRW, submit the following comments regarding the proposed Air Toxics Hot Spots Fee Regulation Amendments.

CAEA believes that the fee structure of "Simple-Intermediate-Complex," allocating cost based on the number of processes conducted at a facility, does not comply with Section 44380 of the California Health and Safety Code which states that fee schedules should be proportionate to the extent of the releases identified in the toxics emissions inventory and the level of priority assigned to that source to the maximum extent practicable. The current and proposed fee structure fails to address this issue of quantity and toxicity.

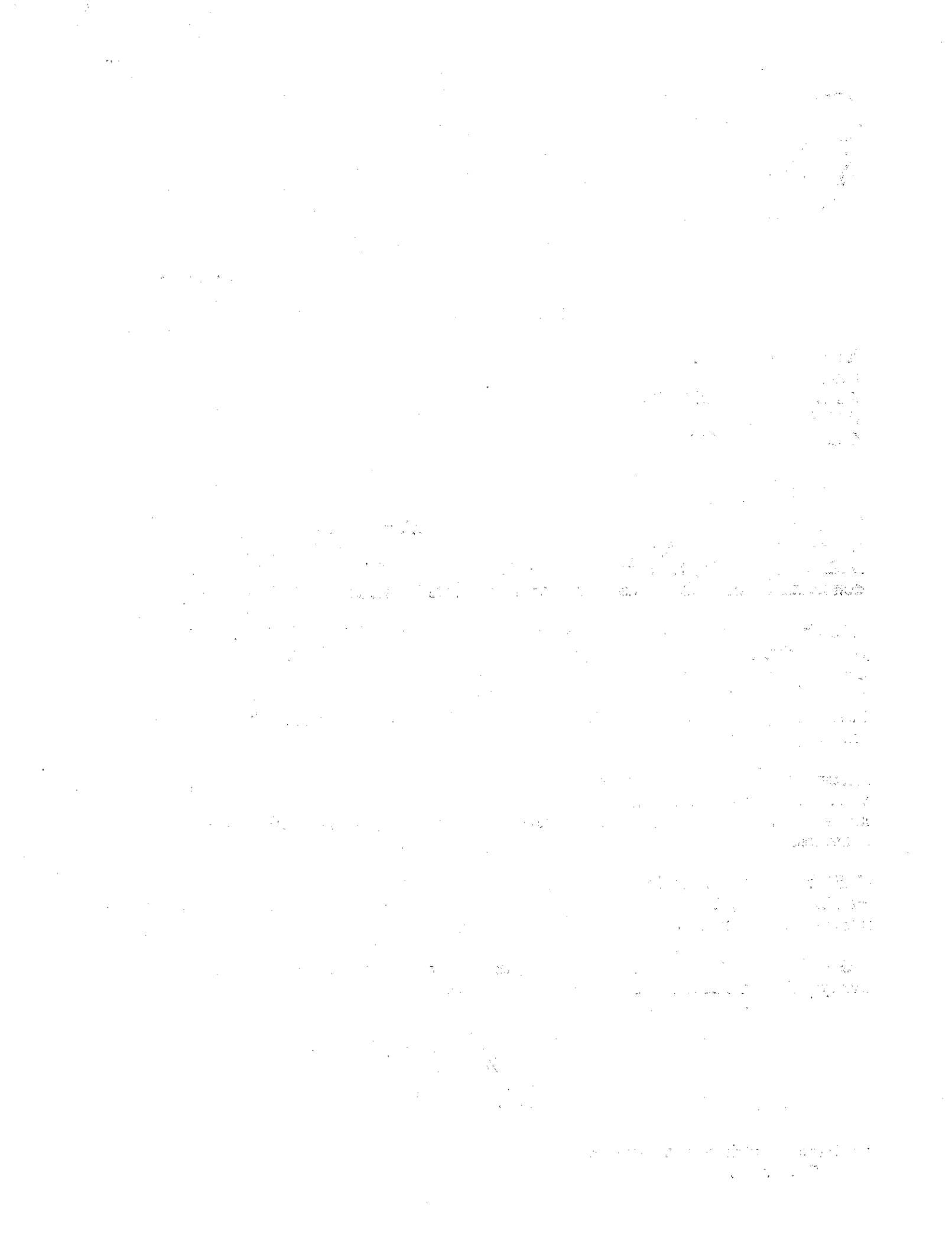
Aerospace facilities typically have many processes with low volume, low hazard emissions. Based on the current fee structure, these facilities would be penalized more heavily than industries engaged in a single process or few processes with high volume toxicity emission activities.

CAEA believes that the Toxic Hot Spots Fee, as required in Section 44380 of the California Health and Safety Code, should be based on the volume and hazard of the toxics emitted, not on the number of processes from which the toxic emissions escape.

I am very concerned that businesses in the San Joaquin Valley may incur substantial fee increases in the Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Program in the 1994-95 period. As you know, many businesses suffered greatly from the tremendous fee increases in the 1993-94 period.

Although the overall state and local collected fees will be less, the shift in allocation to fewer sources in the San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District may result in significantly higher fees for facilities which are not covered by exemptions or fee limitations.

The Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Program in the district is evolving into a maintenance mode after the initial inventory and notification process has been completed. The bulk of the work associated with Phase I and II facilities will be completed in the coming months. The requirements for most of the Phase III facilities are not as comprehensive as those for the larger Phase I and II facilities. Furthermore, recent amendments to state law have significantly reduced the workload associated with the program.

Due to the reduction in the program's workload, the District cut their program 29% this year. The ARB cut theirs by 21%, but this figure reflects a \$150,000 carry-over, resulting in less than a 21% cut. I fail to see any corresponding cuts in the OEHHA budget. Surely, both ARB's and OEHHA's costs can be reduced at least as much as the district's.

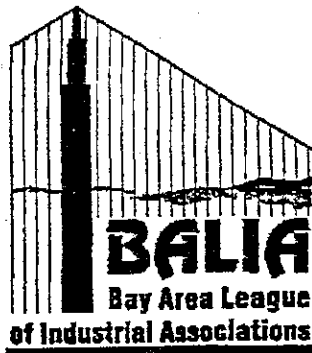

Thank you for considering our comments.

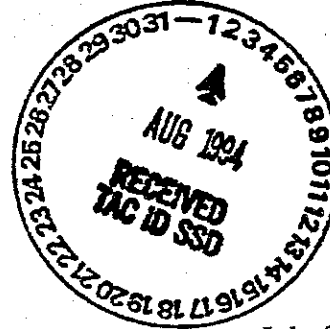

TRW Incorporated requests consideration of the following comments relative to the proposed Air Toxics Hot Spots Fee Regulation amendments. As a major California employer and manufacturer of spacecraft and other high-technology items, TRW has always sought to conduct operations in an environmentally sound manner. Given this paradigm, TRW has strongly supported the State's policy of tying emissions fees directly to volume and toxicity. However, the Board's current proposed amendment to the fee regulation departs from this approach.

While TRW supports the elements of the amendment which would shift administrative costs away from the State to the affected Hot Spot facilities, we believe that the corresponding fee increases should continue to be allocated proportionally. Facilities with no significant process or emission changes should realize a significantly reduced minimal fee for the program. Therefore, we support the Board's proposal that facilities submitting plans and reports indicating exemption from Health Risk Assessment and Notification requirements should have reduced fees.

However, the adoption of "Simple-Intermediate-Complex" criteria of allocating costs removes the fairness which tying fees to emission quantity and toxicity achieved. TRW believes that greater fees should be assessed to facilities with greater total and higher hazard emissions, not to facilities with a greater number of processes. It is the nature of our industry to have many processes, but typically with low volume, low hazard emissions. These facilities would therefore be penalized more heavily than other facilities with single or few processes which result in high toxicity/volume emissions.

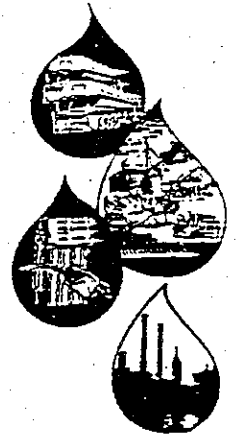

Comments Regarding Amendments to the Air Toxic Hot Spots Fee Regulation (94-7-2)

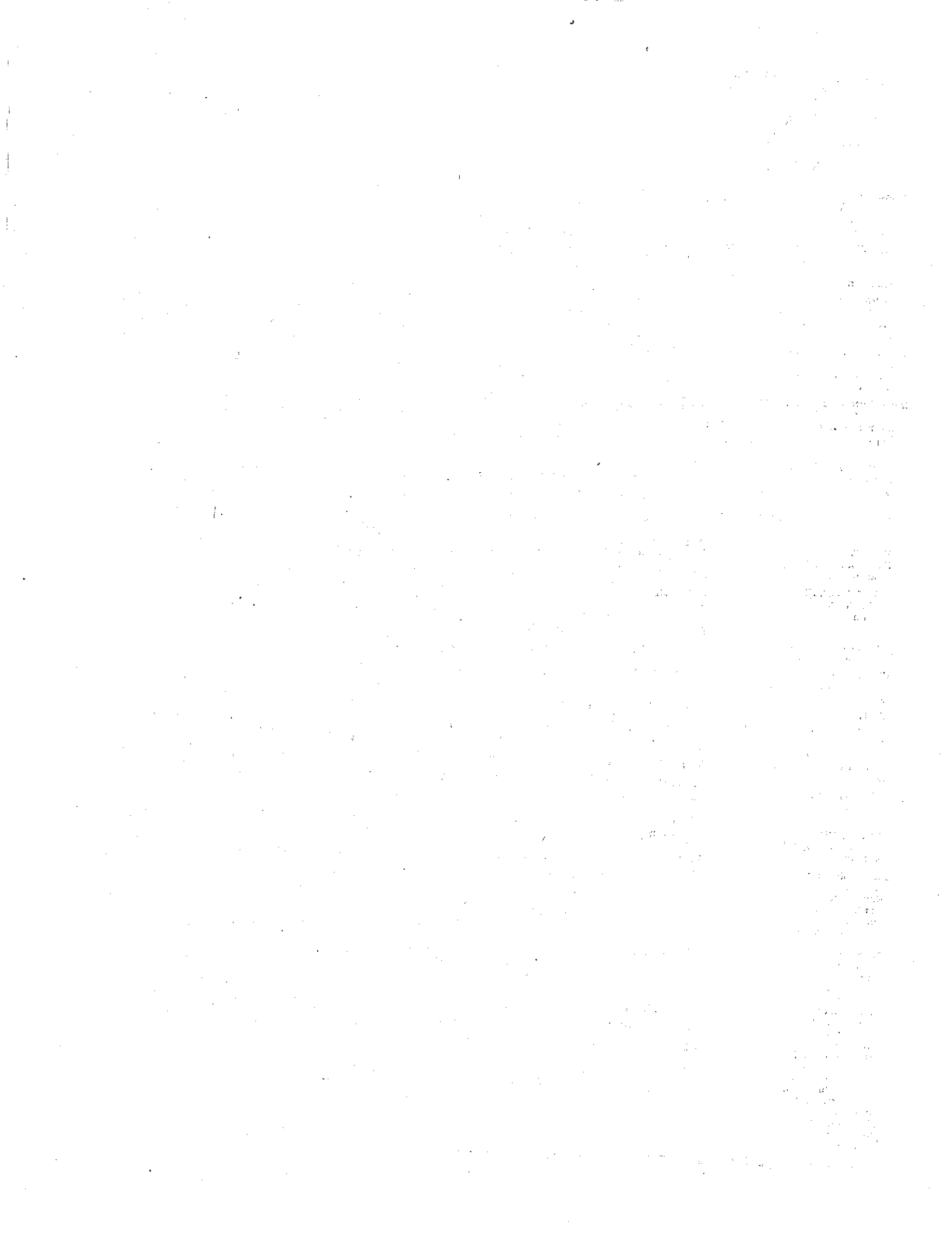
Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed amendment to the toxic hot spots fee regulation. First, the California Independent Oil Marketers Association (CIOMA) would like to commend the Air Resources Board Toxic Hot Spots Program staff for their diligent efforts in working with the regulated industries as this fee proposal was developed. The staff has engaged in exemplary communication effort with our association and the other regulated industries to explain the changes and their probable impact. The program staff also have very willingly listened to our concerns and have addressed them when possible.

CIOMA represents approximately 500 petroleum marketers throughout the state. Our members sell petroleum products to a variety of commercial customers and government agencies, including cities, counties, school districts, police and fire departments, and ambulance services. Our members range in size from very small businesses with five or fewer employees to larger companies with multiple outlets and hundreds of employees. However, all of our members face an ever increasing demand on their operating capital from various fees charged by government agencies. The total cost of these fees threatens ability of this segment of the industry to continue operating. Even the largest of petroleum marketing companies have seen a detrimental impact from fees charged for simply continuing to operate their businesses.

For the most part, our members fall into the industrywide category for the Toxic Hot Spots Program fee and pay some of the lowest fees as a result - a highly unusual situation for petroleum marketers. Although we generally oppose any fee increases, we believe the \$15 assessment the California Air Resources Board made to each district for the state costs associated with each industrywide facility this year is fair. First, the state Toxic Hot Spots Program allowed that fee to be waived, giving districts the options of absorbing the fee or spreading its costs among more complex facilities. Secondly, even when charged to industrywide facilities, it is an appropriate share of the cost of developing this regulation and the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment guidelines.

In addition, we commend the Toxic Hot Spots Program staff for reducing the cap on fees for small businesses. Paying a maximum fee of \$300 is a welcome reduction from the \$700 cap of last year. Our only criticism about the cap is that the maximum level set for a facility's annual gross receipts is very low for the petroleum industry.

Only the smallest of petroleum marketing businesses fall into this category because of the volume of fuel products distributed by this segment of the industry and the cost of these products. As you all know fuel is an expensive product, especially when millions of gallons are sold each month. Of course, the costs of those products recently have been or will be increased by CARB regulations such as the low-aromatic

diesel and reformulated gasoline requirements. The costs of these products also are increased by 30 to 43 cents per gallon by fuel taxes and environmental fees - hardly costs marketers can control. These product costs make it difficult for even the smallest of petroleum marketers to fall within the gross receipts limit since small marketers usually must sell at least \$2 million in fuel each year from each facility to remain viable. Perhaps the cap could be modified to set annual gross receipt limits for various industries, like petroleum marketers, that take into account the costs and pricing of products.

Overall, we believe the staff of the Toxic Hot Spots Program has gone to great lengths to make this program one that enables the small family businesses that make up the petroleum marketing industry to survive while still achieving the goal of protecting public health. This program could easily have been one that devastated this segment of the petroleum industry had the Toxic Hot Spots staff not very carefully balanced public health and business interests. We applaud the staff's efforts.

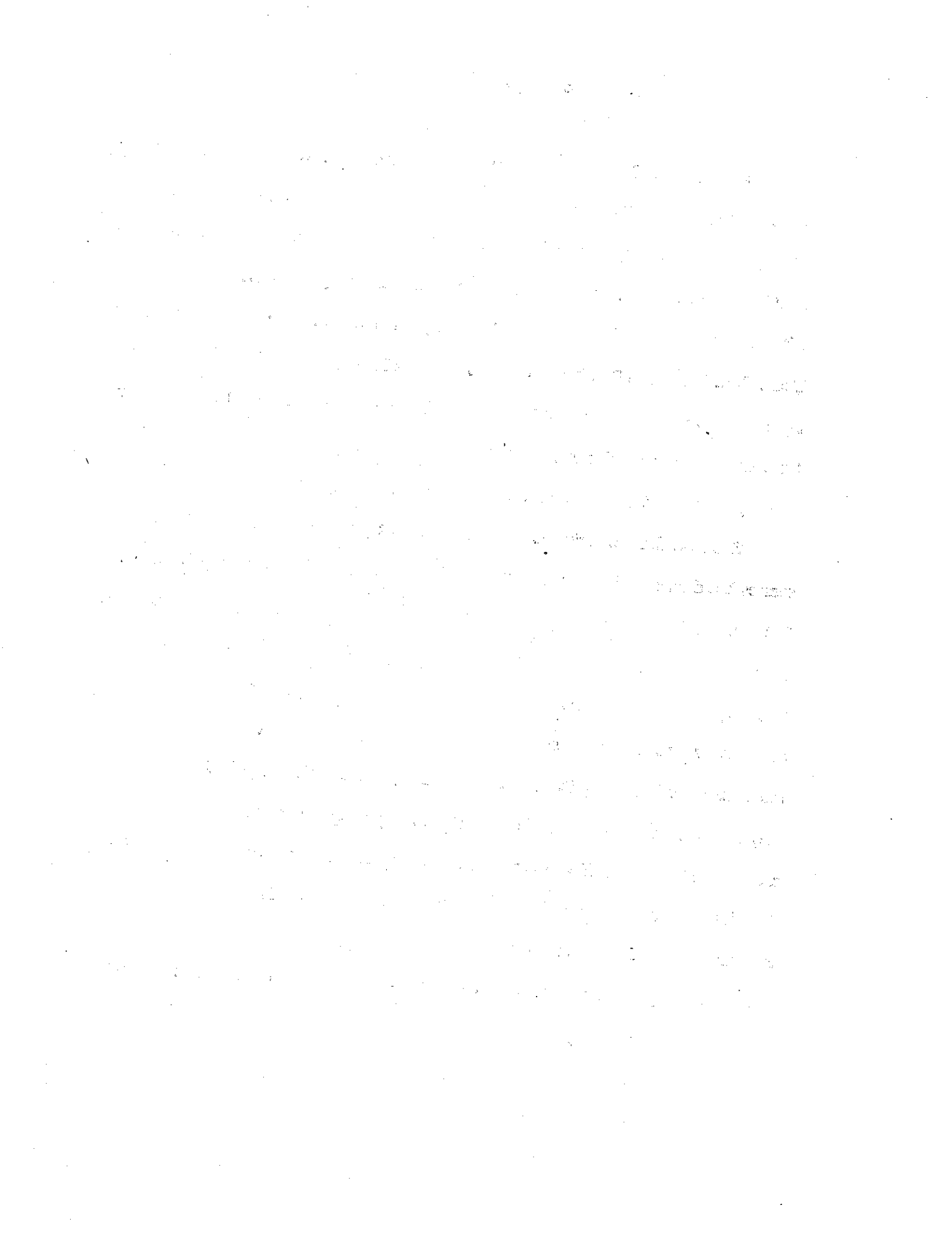

Statement of M. Dean High

Good afternoon Madam Chairwoman and Members of the Governing Board. My name is M. Dean High, Vice President of Pacific Environmental Services, Inc., Baldwin Park, CA. I am appearing here today on behalf of the Metal Finishing Association of Southern California (MFASC). Our members represent over 150 small businesses, typically about 20 employees with annual revenues of about \$750,000. We appreciate the opportunity to comment on the Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Fee Regulation. Carol Foss of Foss Plating attended the workshop on this topic and provided some comments to Mr. Roger Korenberg and other CARB staff members. Our comments today supplement those made earlier by Carol. The workshop was in April; the staff report came out in June; our members received bills in July.

First, we feel the toxics fee schedule still is not providing equitable treatment to all sources based on annual toxic emission rates. The CARB June 1994 report (page V-20) states that "The South Coast Air Quality Management District will not be charging their industrywide facilities". This is not a correct statement. Many of our companies are paying toxic hot spot fees of \$100/year as industrywide members. Others are paying \$700/year as a small business or \$810/year as a plan and report, simple source category. We are not clear on whether the charges are to be annually or every four years. Foss Plating was recently charged \$810 even though they had switched to the non-toxic trivalent chrome plating process in 1989 as a result of recommendations in the CARB's Control Measure for reducing chrome emissions from plating facilities. They are protesting this fee. The facility still uses one small hexavalent chrome rinse tank, and some solvent which hardly justifies 2588 fees.

Secondly, we would like to see a sunset provision in the fee schedules that exempts a

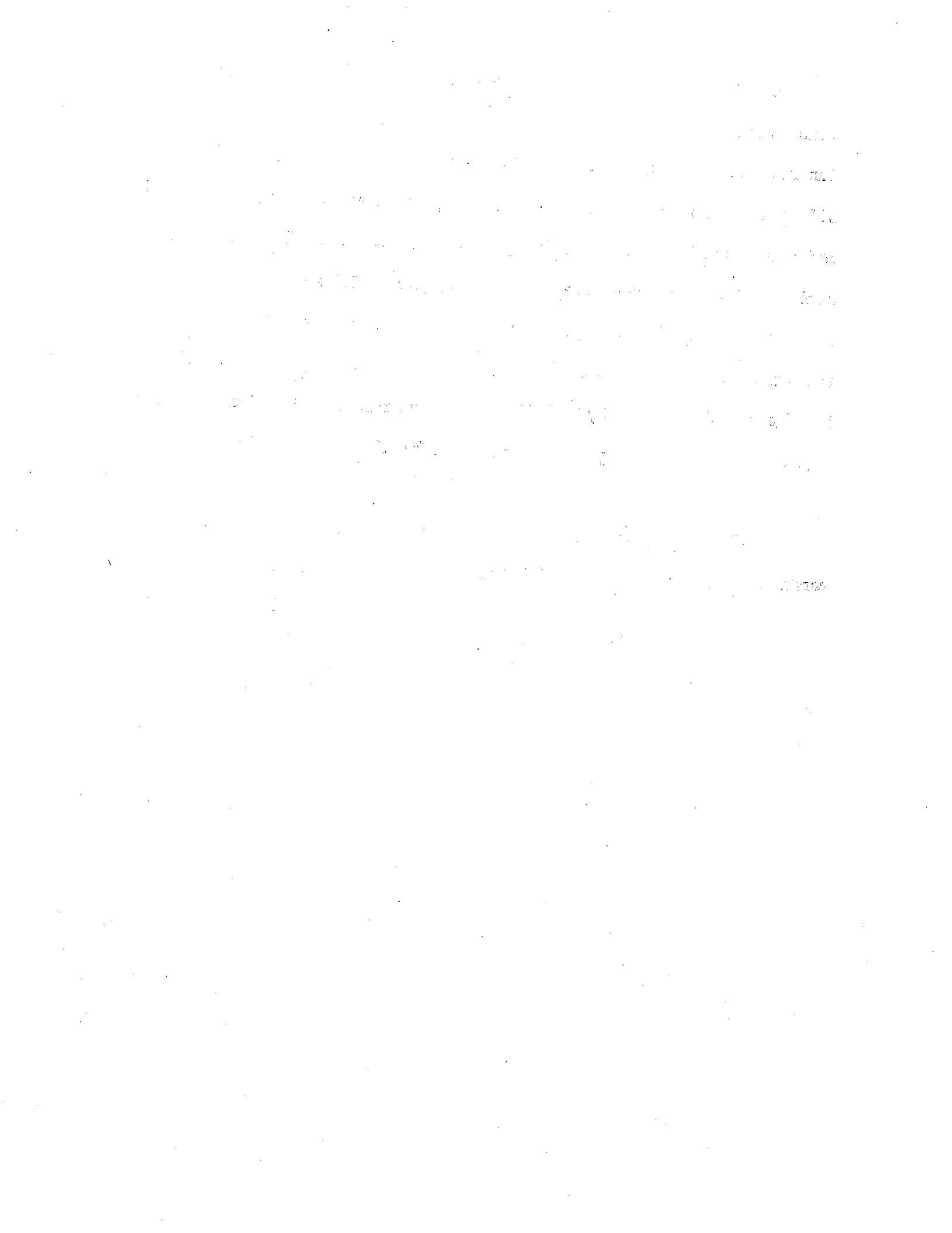


company once its toxic emissions no longer create a health risk to the surrounding community. The metal finishing industry controlled hexavalent chromium emissions between 1989 and 1992 by about 95 to 99.9 percent as a result of the chromium control measures adopted by this Board in 1988. Incidentally, MFASC worked jointly with CARB to develop and apply workable control technology and process changes to achieve the required control levels and we thank this Board for its support and understanding. Our members have now reduced toxic chrome emissions by about 99% but our members' fees have continued or increased. We feel the costs assessed to a company should be related to current toxic health risks as AB1060 (McCorquodale) directs. The staff proposed a 40% reduction in future fees due to the change in reporting requirements from two to four years. Toxic emissions are decreasing, so we would expect an even greater reduction in the fees proposed for the future (more than 40%).

Third, the program activities described in Section III, page 35 of the staff report, includes the development of health risk assessment guidelines. It is our position that the current theoretical assessment procedures overstate the extent of the actual health risks by compounding conservative assumptions. Therefore, the MFASC recommends the allocation of funds from the Hot Spot Fee funds and addition of a requirement in Section III that staff collect ambient air monitoring data to validate results of the dispersion model used for estimating health risks as well as the progress achieved as a result of the program. Such a validation of exposures would lead to more accurate health risk assessments which could improve their public credibility and could reduce the costs to industry for complying with more accurate health risk exposures. Furthermore, use of ambient air quality data should be allowed as an alternative procedure, with comparable scientific validity, for directly identifying health risks. We will make this recommendation at the OEHHA Workshop on August 16, 1994.

Regarding our third point for use of measured air quality exposures, we have serious concerns about the ambient measurements of hexavalent chromium reported by CARB. Ambient data for chrome in the SCAQMD in 1986-1989 prior to the chrome control measure, showed 24-hour average levels of about 0.5 ng/m³. After major reductions of chrome emissions from cooling towers and from metal finishing operations in the basin, data for 1990-1992 show ambient levels of hexavalent chrome to be ten times higher than before controls. The method for testing and analysis was changed but such changes should not result in ten fold variations unless one procedure was wrong. We feel such contradictions to logic require much more investigation and clarification by the staff before we can use such data to validate theoretical dispersion models or to directly quantify a hot spot health risk.

Thank you for your attention. I trust our comments will be received in the same constructive manner as we have intended them.

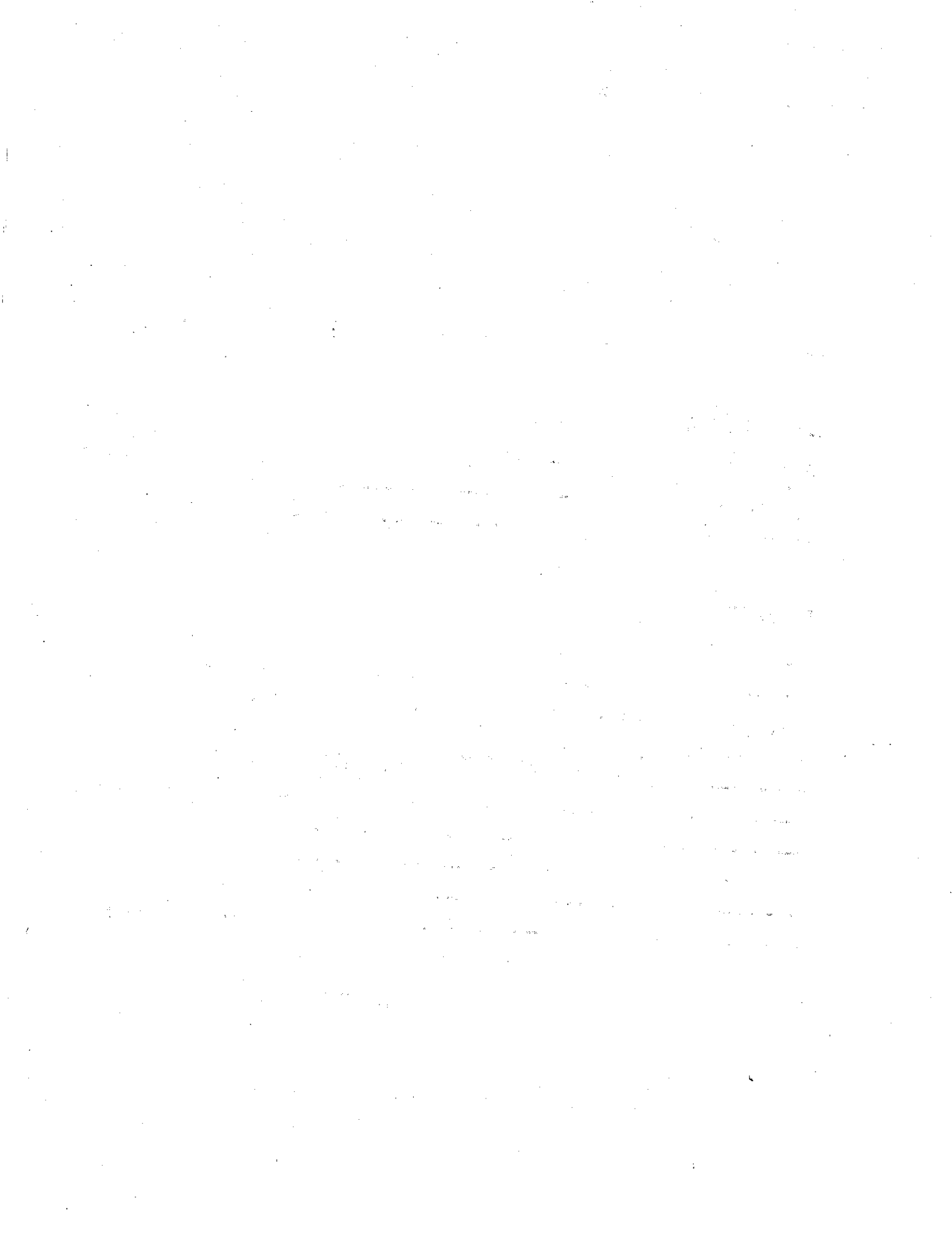

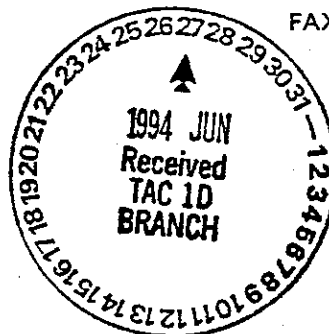

Re: AB2588 Fees, Facility Count Fiscal Year 1994-95 Fee Regulation

Dear Ms. Shiroma:

The District would like to change the facility counts for fiscal year 1994-95 fee regulation. Upon further review, the facility counts for each program category are quite different than those submitted in January.

In January, Northern Sierra Air Quality Management District staff could not locate records indicating what technique the previous APCO used to arrive at last year's facility counts (FY 1993-94). In an attempt to be consistent, the counts submitted this January attempted to replicate his "apparent" approach. Recently these records were located and on review, the approach used was not valid. It was discovered that he counted facilities that AB2588 did not apply to (i.e. < 10 TPY facilities whose SIC is not included in the E-I and E-II appendices) and facilities whose emissions were less than 10 TPY and included in the E-II appendix.

The District has now reviewed its emission inventory and segregated the applicable facilities by the number of SCC's at each facility. The numbers shown in Attachment 1 reflect only those facilities currently subject to the program and under District permit. Of these facilities, only five (5) are technically in the program, having been submitted as Phase I facilities. The rest will be brought into the program this year, rather belatedly.

Please change the Northern Sierra Air Quality Management District facility count for FY 1994-95 Fee Regulation to reflect the numbers shown in Attachment 1. Attachment 2 provides you the Hot Spots Program facilities by name and program category, along with some applicability data. The costs shown are from the preliminary draft "State Costs per Category", dated 5/14/94. Please excuse the lateness of this update.

Gas stations, autobody shops, car dealers with autobody shops, and dry cleaners are not represented in the above facility counts, since the District has not brought those facilities into the Hot Spots Program. Once these facilities have been brought into the Program (hopefully this year), they can legitimately be charged for Program expenses.

In addition, the District received an invoice for \$22,311, dated May 16, 1994, which was based on the above-mentioned facility count error for FY 1993-94: 45 P&R-1&2, one (1) P&R-3to5, and zero (0) P&R-> 5. Correct facility counts are one (1) P&R-1&2, two (2) P&R-3to5, and seven (7) P&R-> 5, which would result in quite a reduction in fees. Using the 1993-94 COST shown in column B of the State Cost per Category, dated 5/14/95 (\$480 for P&R-1&2, \$720 for P&R-3to5, and \$960 for P&R-> 5), the total would be



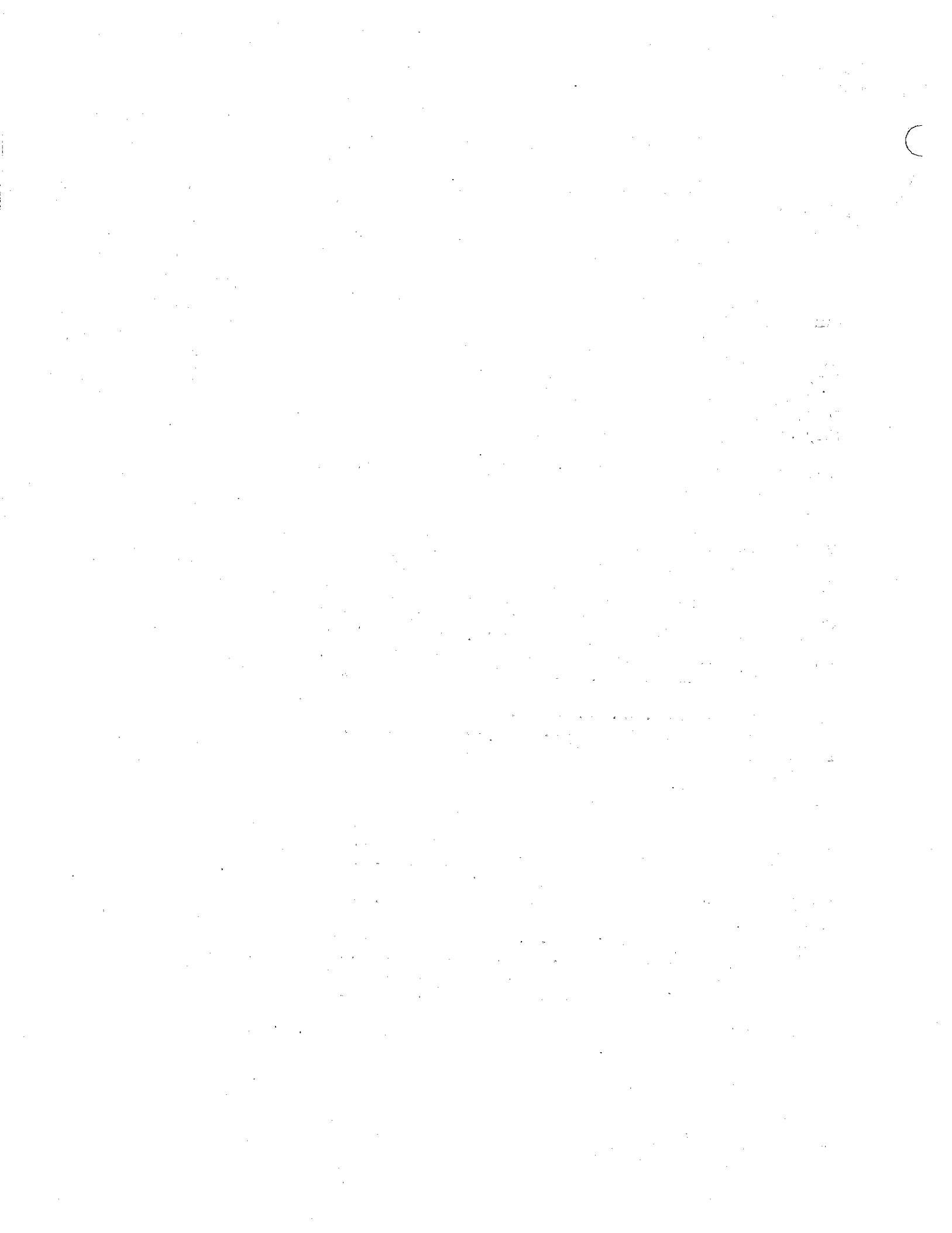

The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District has reviewed and updated the facility count/category information submitted to ARB earlier this year. The revised information is enclosed. Please update your records to reflect these changes.

As you can see, the facility count and the applicable program categories have changed substantially. The changes are due to the following:


- A considerable number of facilities on the original list went out of business.
- In an effort to minimize the burden on some of the smaller facilities, the District decided to move them into the IW category. The District will now be responsible for the inventories, risk assessments and notification (if applicable) for these facilities. Some of the new IW categories include: Chrome platers, crematories, woodworking operations, tire buffers, grain loaders, metal coating, print shops, hospitals and aggregate plants.

Although this approach will result in a greater burden on District staff, we believe it's consistent with the small business assistance and program streamlining efforts of the SMAQMD.

- We've received more risk assessments back from OEHHA indicating significant health risks (SFPP, Blue Diamond Growers, UCD Med Center).

It should be noted that the number of facilities with risk assessments that were under review by the state has been reduced by three from the previous count that was provided by the state. These facilities are E.R. Carpenter, which had already gone through notification; McFarland Energy, which was sold to another operator that may not be subject to the fees; and the Producers Cotton Oil Co. Fresno oil mill, which has been shut down for over three years.

Projected District program costs for the fiscal year remain at 1.3 million dollars. The fees adopted must be adequate to cover the 1.3 million dollar in District expenses after any deductions for state expenses.

The District erroneously thought that an industrywide emissions report could be done, but with the recent clarification on facilities qualifying for this classification, the District now classifies this facility as P&R, SCC 3-5.

W.J. Transue Trucking - Closed plant permanently.

Seneca District Hospital - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. Appendix E-I, Industrywide.

Grass Valley Steelcast - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. SIC is 3325, therefore an Appendix E-II facility. One-time survey required (NO P&R).

Furniture by Thurston - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. SIC is 2511, therefore an Appendix E-II facility. One-time survey required (NO P&R).

Almanor Custom Concrete - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a concrete batch plant (SIC 3273). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

Feather River Rock - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. SIC is 1442, therefore an Appendix E-II facility. One-time survey required (NO P&R).

Jesky & Sons - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a concrete batch plant (SIC 3273). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

Spanish Creek Aggregates - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. SIC is 1442, therefore an Appendix E-II facility. One-time survey required (NO P&R).

White Cap Ready Mix, Portola - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a concrete batch plant (SIC 3273). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

White Cap Ready Mix, Chester - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a concrete batch plant (SIC 3273). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

CA Dept of Food & Ag - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a very small incinerator used to burn illegal fruits and vegetables coming into California at the Truckee check station (SIC 9199). Actual Emissions are less than .001 tons per year. The District does not want to put this facility into the program since this would just cause the facility to dismantle the incinerator. Confiscated materials would then have to be hauled to the landfill.

Hooper and Weaver Mortuary - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. Appendix E-I Industrywide.

Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. Appendix E-I, P&R, SCC 1&2.

Grass Valley Veterinary Hospital - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a very small pathological incinerator used to cremate small animals. Actual Emissions are less than .01 tons per year. The District does not want to put this facility into the program since this would just cause the facility to dismantle the incinerator. The District may elect to submit an Industrywide in FY 95-96.

Agate Sales - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a wood planing mill (SIC 2421). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

Pendola Enterprises (Yuba River Lumber) - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a wood planing mill (SIC 2421). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

Grass Valley Group - This facility (SIC 3663) curtailed its operations related to full time generator use in late 1993 due to excessive environmental regulations with a loss of over 250 local jobs. It now uses its generators for emergency functions only. Emissions will be less than 10 tons per year. The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since the political climate would not tolerate further regulatory interference.

Innovative Metal Fabrication - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. SIC is 3441. Appendix E-I, P&R, SCC 3 to 5.

Hansen Brothers Enterprises - In program as phase 1. Submitted biennial update earlier this year. P&R SCC > 5.

Hansen Bros. Ready Mix - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a concrete batch plant (SIC 3273). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

North Star Rock Products - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. SIC is 1442, therefore an Appendix E-II facility. One-time survey required (NO P&R).

R.J. Miles, Grass Valley Ready Mix - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a concrete batch plant (SIC 3273). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

R.J. Miles, Secret Town - Emissions in 10 to 25 TPY range. P&R, SCC > 5.

Teichert Aggregates - In program as phase 1. Submitted biennial update earlier this year. P&R SCC > 5.

West River, Inc. - Permanently Closed.

Industrial Asphalt - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is an asphalt batch plant (SIC 2951). The District erroneously thought that an industrywide emissions report could be done, but with the recent clarification on facilities qualifying for this classification, the District now classifies this facility as P&R, SCC 3-5.

Ridgerock Quarry - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. SIC is 1429, therefore an Appendix E-II facility. One-time survey required (NO P&R).

Sha-Neva - Emissions in 10 to 25 TPY range. P&R, SCC > 5.

Truckee North Tahoe Materials #1 - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This was a concrete batch plant (SIC 3273), but no longer mixes concrete. They only sell aggregate now (no crushing nor screening at facility). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

Truckee North Tahoe Materials #2 - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is a concrete batch plant (SIC 3273). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

Precious Metal Recovery Co. - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This source is a gold mine (SIC 1041). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

Brush Creek Mining and Development - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This source is a gold mine (SIC 1041). The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

Haskell Peak Logging Co. - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This source is a

woodwaste screen. The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source even though the SIC appears on Appendix E-II since this is a tiny source (emissions < 1/2 ton) and it's located in a very remote area.

Sierra Pacific Industries, Loyalton - In program as phase 1. Submitted biennial update earlier this year. P&R SCC >5.

Pacific Gas and Electric - Emissions less than 10 tons per year (< 0.75 ton). This source is an emergency generator. The District determined that AB2588 does not apply to this source since SIC does not appear on either Appendix E-I nor E-II.

Fehrman Mortuary - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. Appendix E-I Industrywide.

Baldwin Contractors, Chester - Emissions less than 10 tons per year. This is an asphalt batch plant. The District erroneously thought that an industrywide emissions report could be done, but with the recent clarification on facilities qualifying for this classification. The District now classifies this facility as P&R, SCC 3-5.

As stated in my letter dated June 21, 1994, gas stations, autobody shops, car dealers with autobody shops, and dry cleaners are not represented in the above facility counts, since the District has not brought those facilities into the Hot Spots Program. Once these facilities have been brought into the Program, they can legitimately be charged for Program expenses. The District feels that since these facilities will not be billed in FY 1994-95, therefore, they should not be listed in ARB's Fee Regulation, and thus ARB should not bill the District for these facilities. The District has begun its lists for these categories, but has not surveyed them for applicability. The estimated numbers are as follows:

Dry Cleaners - 11 Industrywide.

Printing Shops - unknown number, Industrywide, but will not be attempted in FY 94-95

Autobody shops - approx. 20, Industrywide, will not be attempted in FY 94-95.

Gasoline Stations - 45 Industrywide.

Degreasing - unknown number, will not be attempted in FY 94-95.

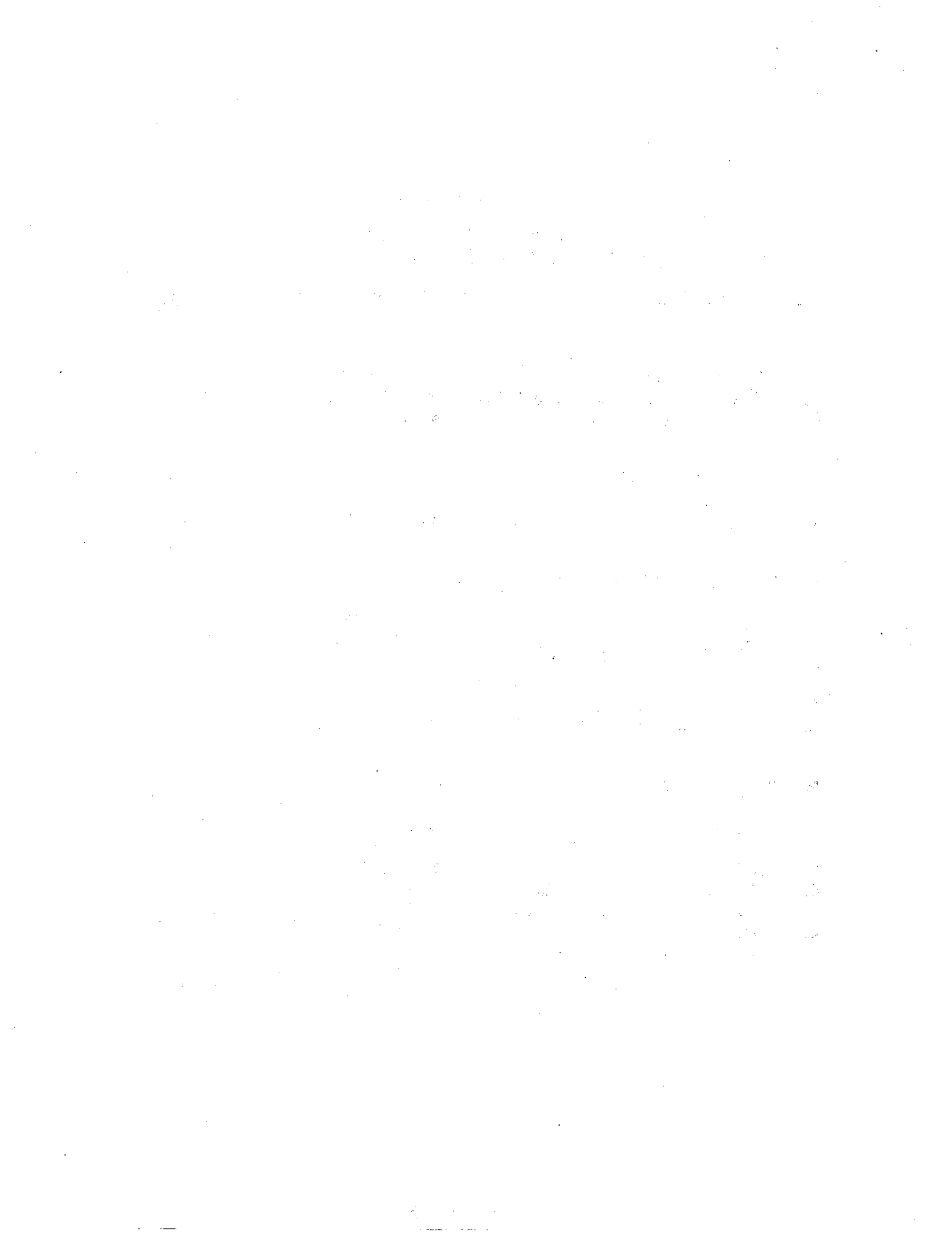

On March 16, 1994, I submitted a Fiscal Year 1994-95 cost estimate to you pursuant to the requirements of the Air Toxics "Hot Spots" Information and Assessment Act (AB2588). This cost estimate for a total of \$4,011,213 was approved by the SCAQMD Board at the March 11, 1994 Board meeting for the implementation of AB2588 program.

Subsequently, cost estimate has been lowered by approximately one million dollars to reflect recent staff reductions and a re-evaluation of contracting needs. The revised estimate of \$3,076,734 is incorporated in the SCAQMD's budget for Fiscal Year 1994-95, which has been adopted at the June 10, 1994 Board meeting. A complete copy of the draft budget and work program has been submitted to your staff earlier. I am now submitting a certified copy of the approved Board letter for the budget. In addition, a summary of the budget showing only the costs for AB2588 program is also attached for your ready reference.

Please revise your Fee Regulation for FY 1994-95 based on the revised cost estimate for SCAQMD. Questions regarding the cost estimate may be directed to Mr. Jay Chen, A.Q.A.C. Supervisor, at (909) 396-2664.



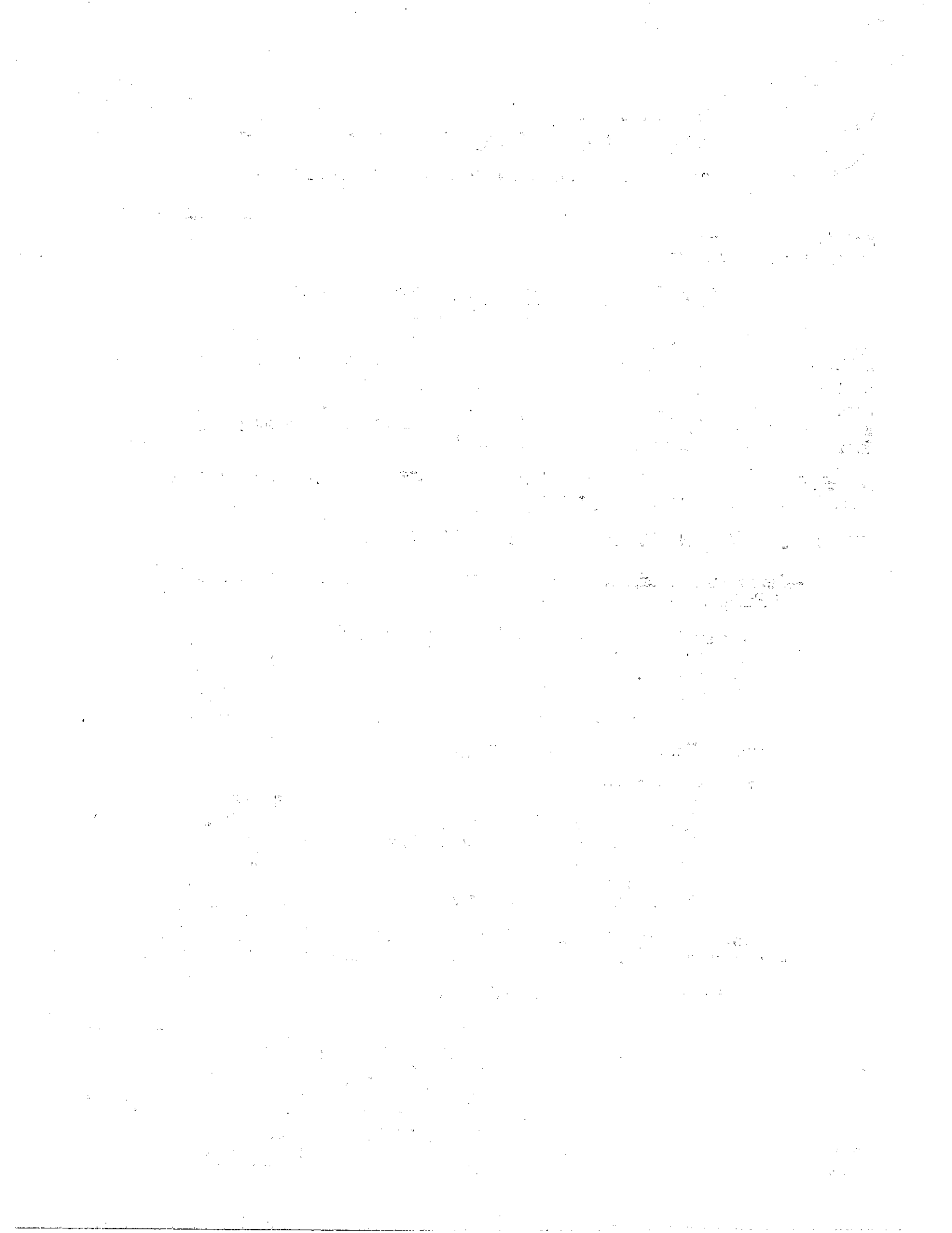

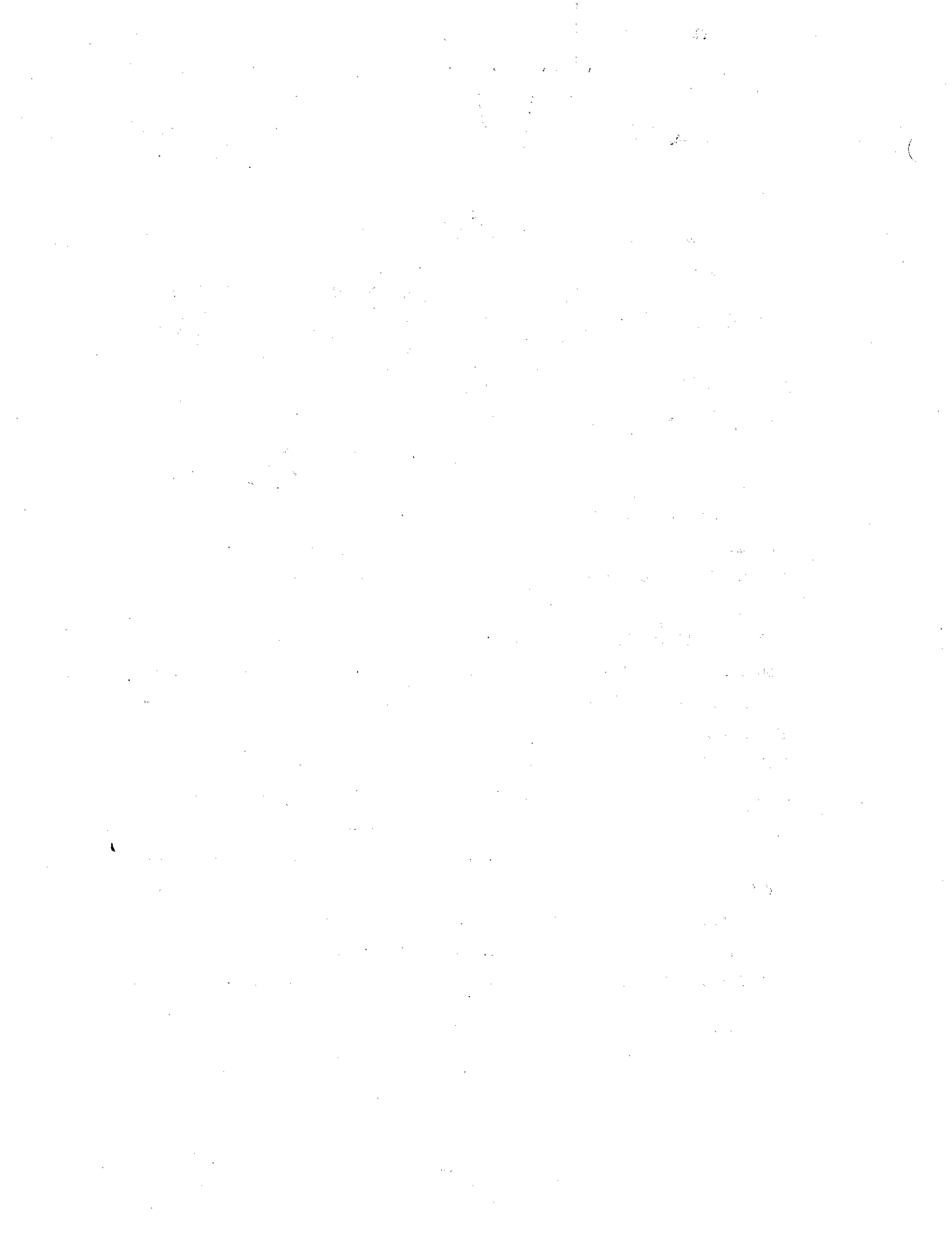

Dear Ms. ^{Genevieve} Shiroma:

I am writing in response to your letter of July 13, 1994, in which you request updated information regarding our District's Industrywide facility counts that will be used for assessing the State's Hot Spots Program costs. The districts were also asked to provide CARB with updated facility counts at the Air Toxics Hot Spots Fee Regulation Committee teleconference held on June 13, 1994.

We have completed a re-assessment of the facility counts for our area, which are included in the enclosed Table. You will note that the number of facilities in the Industrywide category has increased over what had been previously reported. This change reflects the proposed modified definition of "Industrywide facility" included in your letter, and constitutes a more diverse population of source categories that is more consistent with the industrywide programs of CARB and the other districts.

Please note that the Industrywide category is not the only category for which we have provided updated facility counts. In particular, the Plan and Report facility counts have been reduced over what had been previously reported.
